Thirdly my Will and Desire is, that my Son John Satchwell now in England, if the times should ever permit, should have one third part of the Value of the aforesaid Legacies to him and his Heirs for ever. Then I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Rachel Satchwell three Cows and Calves her Choice to her and her heirs for ever.

Item my Will and Desire is that all the rest and residue of my Stock of what kind so ever be sold and the Money arising from the sale to be applied to discharge of my Debts, and the overplus if any to be put to interest for my two Daughters Lettice & Martha Satchwell to them and their heirs for ever Lastly I Appoint Mr. Joel Moore Sole Executor of this my Last will and
