wealth of Virginia being of a sound and disposing mind
and memory do make this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following to wit. I give and bequeath
to my beloved wife Elizabeth Thoroughgood the use of the
Tract and plantation of Land, whereon I now live con-
taining three hundred Acres during her natural life and
after her decease I give and bequeath the said Tract and
plantation of Land to my Nephew William Thoroughgood
Son of James and Elizabeth Nimmo and to his
Heirs for ever. Item I give to my wife Elizabeth Thoroughgood
the use of the following five Slaves, during her natural
life to wit. Ned, Daniel Dick Rob and Jacob and after
my wife's decease I give the use of the said five Slaves to
my sister Elizabeth Nimmo wife of Mr. James Nimmo,
during her natural life, and after my said sister's decease
I give and bequeath the said five Slaves. Ned, Daniel, Dick,
Rob and Jacob to be equally divided amongst all my said

76 Sisters Children that shall be then living at the time of my said
Sister her Death. Item I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife
Elizabeth Thoroughgood my Negro Girl Jenny to her and her Heirs
for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Nephew John Nimmo
my Negro man Slave named Caesar to him and his Heirs for ever.
I give and bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Nimmo my old Negro
Man named Ross, to her and her Heirs for ever. Item, after
my just debts are paid, I give and bequeath the remainder of my
personal Estate, to my said beloved wife and her Heirs for ever
Lastly. I nominate and appoint my beloved friends, my
brother in law Mr. James Nimmo, and Capt. Samuel Thoroughgood
Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness
whereof I the said William Thoroughgood Junr. have hereunto set
my Hand and Seal this seventh day of October Anno Domini
One thousand seven hundred and Seventy nine.
