I William Thorongood Junr. of Princess Anne County, and Common Wealth of Virginia being of a sound mind disposing mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Thorongood the use of the tract and plantation of land whereon I now live containing three hundred acres during her natural life and after her decease I give and bequeath the said tract or plantation of land to my nephew William Thorongood negro son of James and Elizabeth Kinno and to his Heirs for ever Item I give to my wife Elizabeth Thorongood the use of the following five slaves during her natural life to wit Ned, Daniel Dick, Nat and Jacob and after my wifes decease I give the use of the said five slaves to my sister Elizabeth Kinno wife of Mr. James Kinno during her natural life and after my said Sisters decease give and bequeath the said five slaves Ned, Daniel, Dick, Nat and Jacob to be equally divided amongst all my said

Sisters Children that shall be then living at the time of my said Sisters her Death, him I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife Elizabeth Thorongood my Negro Girl Jenny to her and her Heirs for ever Item I give and bequeath to my Nephew John Kinno my Negro man Slave named Caesar to him and his Heirs for ever I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth Kinno my old Negro Wench named Rose to her and her Heirs for ever Item after my just debts are paid I give and bequeath the remainder of my personal Estate to my said beloved wife and her Heirs for ever Lastly I nominate and appoint my beloved Friends my brother in law Mr. James Kinno, and Capt. Samuel Thorongood Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said William Thorongood junr. have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this seventh day of October anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and Seventy nine.

once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testa-  
ment in manner and form as follows Item I give and bequeath  
all unto my son William Bonney the plantation wherein I  
formerly did live containing one hundred and forty acres more  
or less adjoining the Lands of Henry Harrison and Stephen  
Bonney likewise one hundred acres, and will the said be aint-  
to have till after his Mother's death. I give the above Lands and  
Goods to him and his Heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto  
my son Nathan Bonney the plantation wherein I now live
