The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above named David McConahan his heirs & assigns or any of them shall at any time from hence forth peaceably & quietly have hold occupy possess & enjoy all that tract of plantation of land situated lying & being in the eastern branch precinct & country abovesaid near New Town containing on hundred acres more or less to every part and parcel thereof mentioned to be bargained & sold by the above subscriber Thomas Carroway to the said David McConahan int by a certain indenture of leases & lease bearing even date with those presents made & between yds Thomas Carroway of the one part by above named David McConahan of the other part clearly discharged & otherwise sufficiently bound herein to pay from all manner of estates & losses & circumstances whatsoever that then the obligation to be void of nond effect otherwise to remain in full force power
