

In the Name of God Amen I Richard Hoskins of princeps Anne county being very sick & weak in body but of sound memory praise be almighty God for it I bequeath my body to the earth & my soul to God who gave it I desire a Christian burial at the discretion of my friends as I shall hereafter name & for the more I do appoint this to be my last will & Testament I then I give & bequeath unto Margret Brock Daughter of James and Mary Brock my plantation whereon I now live with all privileges thereto belonging to her & to her heirs lawfully begotten of her body: only my loving sister Mary Brock to have her life time in & about said plantation: but if in case of about named Margret Brock should die without such heirs as is about named then I said land to go to Mary Brock Daughter of & aforesaid James & Mary to her and to her heirs lawfully begotten as aforesaid and I then I give & bequeath unto Margret Brock my bed and furniture belonging to it I then I give & bequeath to my sister Mary Brock one large pot & pot hooks I then I give & bequeath unto Margret and Mary Brock one small pot & a poeum I then my will is and it is my will that after all my lawfull debts be paid what is left of my Estate be Equally divided between my sister Mary Brock & Margret Brock & Mary Brock Daughter of & aforesaid James & Mary I then after my Decease I do appoint my brother in law James Brock & my sister Mary Brock to be my whole & sole Ex^{rs} of this my last will & Testament whereunto I have set my hand & fixed my seals this second Day of October Anno Domini 1716
