 it me of grace & trusting in the merits of my Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive full
 pardon of all my sins be before my last will & Testament of last day my body to be buried in
 such a Decent manner as may be & thereafter named it shall seem meet for my worldly goods
 I have bequeathed full month money & my goods & my wife of John Brect
 one & a half to be delivered immediately after my death & provided upon the Condition
 that she shall forthwith send away within three months after my death my wife & bequeathed
 for the residue of my Estate of what money I may have or shall receive unto my wife
 Sarah Plunton her heirs for ever & she by appointment to be my whole sole & of this
 last will & Testament In witness whereof I have signed & written these words to wit
 my hand and Seal of 3rd day of April 1721
