In the Name of God Amen 4th Day of may in the year of our Lord God 1719. I Robert Bray in County of princess Anne being Sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to god therefore taking unto mind of mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordaine this my last will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give & recommend my soule into the hands of god that gave it & for my body I commend it to the earth to be buried in a Christianlike & decent manner at the discretion of my Ex^{rs} hereafter named nothing doubting to receive the same at the general resurrection by the mighty power of God as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased god to lend me I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner & forms: my Just debts being paid I give the same as followeth I give & bequeath to my loving wife my riding horse & one negro man called goo: & one negro girl called moll during her life & after her decease my negro fellow goo: to my son Plomer & his heirs & likewise my negro girl called moll to my daughter mary Bray to her & her heirs forever & her increase my negro girl moll to be delivered to my daughter mary when she comes of age or married & likewise my negro: goo: to my son plomer when he comes to age after my wifes decease I give & bequeath to my loving wife Iacomin Bray eighty eight acres of land lying in woods & binding upon the negro swamp & after my wifes decease the said Tract of land eighty eight acres to fall to my son plomer I also give unto my wife two gold rings: I give unto my son plomer one gold ring the poroy of it (remember the giver) I also give unto my daughter mary one gold ring: I also give & bequeath to my loving wife all my stock of cattle & hogs & mowables & immowables I also leave two Draft Steers to be sold for money to pay my Debts I give unto my brother in law In. wishard two Sows & one pigge belonging to the little ponn I make & ordaine my loving wife Iacomin Bray to be my whole & sole Ex^{rs}: of this my last will & Testament as witness my hand & fixed my Seale
