Be it known unto all Christian men by these presents that I James Dauge of the Parish of Lynhaven & County of Prince Anne have with my own free will & Voluntary Consent & for divers good causes & considerations me herein to moving but more especially the particular love I bear unto my well beloved Brother Rich^d Dauge have given & granted & by this present deed of gift do give & grant & Confirm & Assign unto the said Rich^d Dauge & unto his heirs forever a certain piece or parcel of wood land grounds containing forty five acres more or less situate lying & being in the County of Prince Anne being part of a parcel of land that I now live on & is the west end or part of the plantation whereon I now live & is divided from the other part of the said plantation by a line of marks Trees that our father William Dauge made before his death in the presence of Peter Malbone & Cornelius Henley the same land being the part that my father Wm Dauge intended for him my aforesaid brother Rich^d & marks is out for him before his death & according to that bounds be the same more or less for forty five acres I freely & absolutely give to Rich^d & his heirs forever the aforesaid forty five acres of land more or less according to the known & reputed bounds with all the right, profits, privileges & immunities & Hereditaments whatsoever to the said land belonging or in any ways Appurtenanting. TO HOLD the aforesaid forty five acres of land more or less with all the right, profits, privileges & immunities whatsoever therein to belonging or in any wise Appurtenanting unto the aforesaid Rich^d Dauge & his heirs forever & the said J^r Dauge for my self my heirs & assigns do Covenant & grant to & with the said Rich^d Dauge his heirs & assigns as aforesaid that I have full power & Lawfull Authority to give grant & Confirm the aforesaid forty five acres of land more or less as before mentioned so that the said Rich^d Dauge & his heirs as aforesaid shall enjoy from time to time & at all times hereafter lawfully peaceably & quietly have hold, occupy, possess and enjoy the aforesaid forty five acres of land more or less & the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise Appurtenanting without any manner of lawful let, trouble, hindrance, molestation or Interruption of or from any person or persons whatsoever lawfully claiming the same by any act, Title, consent, or procurement of mine.
