give an hundred & fifty Shillings for & towards the Cure of her Logg. — It I give
my moors formerly Mary Lossly five pounds — It I give unto my two daugh-
ters Mary & Ann Kingman four yards & a half of dowlas seven yards & a half of garden
these remnants of Callico seven yards of striped & colored mawlin a remnant of
striped houting & four silk handkerchiefs which is now in my house to be equally
divided between them — It I give unto my daughter Ann Kingman my plantation
whereon I now live with all y^e lands & appurtenances thereunto belonging & all the
cattle & hogs & the for the room & negroes named as follows the Honl, Tom, & Sus &
my future increase y^e said land & negroes I give to my daughter Ann & y^e heirs of her
body lawfully begotten for ever, & she to be possessed of all my estate as I have given
her by this my will when she attains to y^e age of fifteen years, but if in case
said Daughter should die without heirs as aforesaid that then I give all that I have
given her by this my will, that is to say my plantation & negroes for & towards the
support & maintenance of a free school for the bringing up of poor orphan children
education & good learning & that y^e said free school be kept upon my land & the said
negroes for the full support of a master to perform y^e duty as aforesaid and then
other uses what so ever; — It I give unto m^r. Charles Loyer one horse called by the
name of old Buck one bridle & saddle & to Capt. Francis Land I give my young horse
called buck one saddle & bridle to be delivered to them after my death — It I give
unto my daughter Ann Kingman all the residue & remainder of my estate both
real & personal not before disposed off by this my will after all my just debts an

other use what so ever; - I give unto m^r. Charles Sayer an sherriff called by th^e
 name of old buck one bridls & saddle to be delivered to Capt. Francis Land I give my young horse
