 principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of god that gaurd it to my
 body I recommend to the earth to be buryed in such Decent Christian Buriall: I desire
 of my Executors not doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same againe
 by the mighty power of God & as Touching such worldly Estate it hath pleased almighty God to
 bestow in this life I give & dispose of the same in the following manner & form: I give &
 bequeath to my Son Charles the plantation whereon I live with all the Land adjoining
 provided my Son Charles shall so Convey & make a good sure firm Title to my Son
 Rodolphus of all that plantation Land whereon I live & as yet I do not dwell to him &
 his heirs: but if my Son Charles do not make over it: a bounde plantation to my Son
 Rodolphus & his heirs then I give this whereon I now live to my Son Rodolphus: his heirs but
 if either of my Sons Charles or Rodolphus should Die in their minority or without Issue

 cloathes & my pistols & holsters & sword & belts: I then I give & bequeath to my Son Rodolphus
