Item I give and bequeath unto the said Marian Heeling my Swamp Land and my Part of Marsh at the Old Inlet to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto the said Marian Heeling One Negro Girl named Sarah to her and her heirs for ever and one Large Hote that was her Father's. Item I give and bequeath unto Betty Dale One Negro Girl named Judy to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto Rachel Dale four Negroes Luke Dinah Affrica Robin to her and her Children but if she should die without any Children then I give the said Negroes Between Betty Dale and Marian Heeling to them & their Heirs. Item I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth Dale One Negro Man named Cesar and all the rest of my Estate that I have not already given to her and her heirs for ever.  the Land is not to be rented out nor the Negroes to be hired but for her to
 make what she can while the Children want them I give to my Daughter
 Elisabeth Cornick One Cow and three Sharlings Craps Rile and flour
 shuck of 1/2 p. yard to her and heirs for ever I give and bequeath unto my Loving
 Wife Betty Cornick and unto my three Children all the rest of my personal Estate
 to be equally divided between them Nothen and them and I do make and declare
 my loving Wife Betty Cornick my Whole and sole Execut^r of this my last Will and
