Shillings Current money of Virginia to the said Robert Land in hand paid by the
said Hezekiah Brown at or before the sealing and Delivery of these Presents the Deeds
whereof he doth hereby acknowledge he the said Robert Land hath Granted Demised
and to farm let and by these Presents doth Grant Demise and to farm let unto the
said Hezekiah Brown One certain Tract or parcel of Land containing by Estima-
tion One hundred Acres more or less Situate lying and being in the County of Prin-
cipes Anne on the main Road that leads up to Plunge and bounded as follows
beginning at a Chestnut Oak and thence on James Masons Line Easterly to
a marked Stone thence Northerly to William Oakham thence true Thence
Northerly to a Corner White Oak thence Southerly to the first beginning Station
