I give & bequeath my debt into hands of almighty God
of whose infinite mercy to receive full pardon & remission
of my Lord & saviour Jesus Christ & a joyful re-
ward for what temporal estate I have thought fit to give
to them. I give & bequeath to my son lordus Boush
whom I now live with all y^e Swamp land thereto adjoining that did form
belong to my deceased brother Horatio woodhouse to him & his heirs
for ever only I reserve to my loving husband this life time in
said plantation & Swamp land my will is that my son
in my loving husband only said lands during his natural life. I give
and bequeath to my son maxim Boush my plantations called Crooked
Curt noys joining together with all y^e land thereto belonging to him my
son maxim to his heirs for ever only reserving y^e said land to my loving
husband during his natural life. I give & bequeath to my daughter
mary Boush my Indian woman called Rachel with all her present & future
increase to her my said daughter mary & to heirs for ever. I give
my marsh & sand banks at the Table of pines to be equally divided between
my two sons lordus & maxim to them & their heirs for ever & do hereby
constitute & appoint my loving husband whole Exor of this my last will an
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seals without
force or Compulsion of my husband but of a free voluntary goodwill of my
own with the consent of my husband this 13th of march 1732/3
