 Parish of Synthaven in Virg being very sick & weak be-
 st, I give & Bequeath to my loving wife Frances Shepard the use of two negroes
 during her natural life to wife Negroe & Harry, & after her decease to be divided
 amongst my four children. I give & Bequeath to my Daughter Mrs. Shepard
 the first negro child that any of my negro wenchess bringe that lives to be six
 Year old, & to be rived up to my wifes cost. I give & Bequeath to my daughter
 Mrs. Shepard my negro girl named Pleasant to her heirs forever. I give
 & Bequeath to my four children all the rest of my negroes that is not already given
 in way to be divided amongst them when they come to age or die of many
 I give & Bequeath to my loving wife Mrs. Shepard the use of my plantation
 wherein I now live during her natural life & after her decease to my son Smith
 Shepard & his heirs forever. I give & Bequeath to my son Wm Shepard my Plan-
 tation of land wherein John Brown now lives to him & his heirs forever. I give
 & Bequeath to my two sons Smith & Wm Shepard my swamp land to be divided
 between them & their heirs. I give & Bequeath to my son Smith Shepard my
 pistols of sword to him & his heirs forever. I give & Bequeath to my loving wife
 Mrs. Shepard all the rest of my personal chattel that is not already given, to bring
 up my children on to her & her heirs forever, & further I do appoint my loving
 wife Mrs. Shepard my whole sole care of this my last will & Testament for want
