bequeath unto my loving wife Ann Albritton one bay mare bridled & saddled one
bed bodistead & bolster one red rugg one Cotton blanket one small Trunk one
powder dish in William Simmons hands one chest lock & key one ewe one Iron
pot pot racks pot hooks & frying pan two saws & pigg one powdering Tub & what
in it all my Corn - I then I give & bequeath unto my son James Albritton my horse
one mill all my fadlers Tools one bed bodistead bolster two blankets & rugg one
green stone marring him my whole & sole Exor of this my last will & testament
abjuring & disavowing all former wills by me made heretofore. and for my land
& my will & desire should be sold for the payment of my debts & for the rest of my
Estate to be equally divided between my wife Ann Albritton & my son Ja: Albritton
after my decease In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seals the
day & date above written
