 Albritton that gave it nothing Doubtless but at the general resurrection to obtain immortality
 will - for all my sins My body to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executor
 named as for my worldly Estate which God of his mercy has been pleased to bestow
 on me in this life gives & bequeath in manner following - Imp. I give and
 bequeath unto my loving wife Ann Albritton one bay mare bridled saddle one
 bed bedstead & bolster one red rugg one Cotton blanket one small trunk one
 powder drif in william Simmon's hands one chest lock & key one lace one iron
 pot potrach pot hooks & frying pan two Sewing pins one powdering Tub & whits
 in all my Cloaths & Stoen I give & bequeath unto my son James Albritton my hope
 one mill att my fadlers Tools one bed bedstead bolster two blankets & ruggs one
 gristone making him my whole & sole Exec of this my last will & testament
 abjuring & disavowing all former wills by me made heretofore. And for my land
 & in my will desire should be sold for the payment of my debts for the rest of my
 Estate to be equally divided between my wife Ann Albritton & my son Ja: Albritton
 after my decease in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the
 Day of January 1730 - I have written this will in my own handwriting
 in my presence
