 be to almighty God for it do make this my last will & Testament first I give & bequeath my soul unto the
 Lord Jesus Christ hoping in through his merits for pardon & redemption for my sins & my bod to the
 earth from whence it was taken to be buried at y^e discretion of my Executors. I I give unto my son Jⁿ.
 Holmes my plantation whereon I now live after his mother's decease to him & his heirs also my mill I
 give unto my son John also I give him two horses & their harness till he shall come to age one black
 one of two years old, & one brinded & white one of three years old also I give him one ewe & her increase till
 he shall come to age also I give him one feather bed & bolster one rug one blanket one shawl all of them
 to be good also I give him one Iron pot that will hold aboute three or four gallons & one new powder
 dish anful of his powder and al y^e remainer part of my Estate I give unto my beloved wife mat-
 thews brother Robert Holmes my Executor of this my last will & Testament this 6. Day of Jan^y 1723
