I give & bequeath to my son William Ackis one hundred acres of y^e land which
I bought of my brother John Ackis my desire is that shall have y^e westward end
whereon the house & orchard is where my brother John lived on to him & his heirs
for ever also my bed & furniture whereon now lie to him & his heirs for ever
I give & bequeath to my son Francis Ackis y^e other part of my land which I bought
of my brother John Ackis being y^e eastward end of that land which is called and
known by y^e name of y^e ridge field to him & his heirs for ever also my negro man
Tommy to him & his heirs for ever. - I give & bequeath to my son Nath: Ackis
my land whereon I now live being y^e land which my father bought of Arth:
Barker to him & his heirs for ever. - I give unto my two Daughters Sarah &
Frances Ackis one h^{lf} of three y^ears old to each of them. - I give & bequeath
all the remainder of my estate after my debts are paid to be Equally divided
amongst my children being six in number three sons & three Daughters
I do make ordain & appoint my friend William Cartwright to be my Ex^r
to see this my last will & Testament performed In witness whereof I have
