 hands I commit my soul & as for my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bestow upon
 me I give & dispose as followeth after all my Just Debts & funeral expenses first being paid
 my hereafter I give & bequeath unto my daughter Francis Attwood my now
 boy named Peter after y^e Deceased of her mother. It: I give & bequeath unto my Loving wife
 Elizabeth Attwood all my ready money which is about nine or ten pounds. It: I give and be-
 queath unto my daughter Francis two barons three dishes two porringers five plates & one
 tankard & also one feather & furniture all to be good & said things to be paid her when she
 comes of age or day of marriage. - It: I give & bequeath unto my daughter Francis all my
 Lands unto her & her heirs for ever & in case she die without such heir then I give y^e same unto my brother
 Thomas Attwood. - It: I give & bequeath unto my Loving wife & my daughter Francis all y^e rest of my Estate
 that is not her given by this my will to be Equally divided between them & likewise make & ordain & Consti-
 tute & appoint my said Loving wife & my brother Tho: my whole & sole Ex^{rs} of this my last will & Testament.
