bor named Peter after y<sup>e</sup> decease of her mother It: I give & bequeath unto my loving wife  
Elizabeth Attwood all my ready money which is about nine or ten pounds: It: I give and be  
queath unto my daughter Francis two bars one third & the other two pence of fine plate born  
tarnished & also one of feather furniture all to be good y<sup>e</sup> said things to be paid her when she  
comes of age or Day of marriage: - It: I give & bequeath unto my daughter Francis all my  
lands & ten to her & her heirs for ever & in case she die without such heir then I give y<sup>e</sup> same unto my brother  
Thomas Attwood - It: I give & bequeath unto my loving wife & my daughter Francis a legacy of my estate  
that is not her given by this my will to be Equally Divided between them & his wife in the manner & Consti-  
tute & appoint my said loving wife & my brother Tho: my whole & sole Ex<sup>c</sup> of this my last will & Testament.  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of February 1719
