 each their respective Negro when they arrive to the Age of Brightness or Day of Mar  
 riage which shall first happen. Item I Give unto my beloved Wife Mary the life  
 of my two Negroes Myrhaa & Peter during her Natural life & at her Decease  
 the said Slaves to be sold & the Money equally divided between my seven Daugh  
 ters Elizabeth Marguette Martha Frances Anne Sarah and Amy them & their  
 heirs for ever Item My Will and Desire is further that my Negro John & Peter  
 be sold out immediately after my Decease and the money arising from his

 Death to be sold and the money Equally to be divided between my second Daugh-  
 ters Elizabeth, Margaret, Martha, Frances, Anne, Sarah & Amy them & their heirs  
 for ever. It My Will and Desire is that my Beloved Wife Mary and my Son Robert  
 hathwight be Executors to see this my Last Will & Test be duly Executed. Witness
