In the Name of God Amen That I John Capper of the Parish of Synhaven and County of Princess Anne being very sick and weak &c. Now I give and bequeath unto my son James Capper the Land that belonged to Edward Cannon up to the River or Lox Ocean that divides the said Land from the Plantation whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever and also one Cow & Calf & a two year old Heifer also one Cow & Lamb & Two Lambs & three pigs & also one feather Bed and all the furniture thereunto belonging. And I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Capper the Land that was Dennis Cannons up to a run that leads from the Woods to the Marsh of said Run divides the Plantation whereon I now live from that Plantation whereon Thorodged Capper now liveth to him and his heirs forever also one Cow and Calf and year old one Cow and Lamb one Cow and her piggy and one Bed and the furniture thereunto belonging. If I give and bequeath unto my son John Capper all the remainder of my high Land to him and his heirs forever. If my give unto my three Boys above named all my Marsh Land to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever. If I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Capper two young Cows and two Calves and a two year old heifir. If I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Margaret Capper One Cow & Calf & a Heifer.
