In the Name of God Amen I William Ellogood of prince ann County being very Sick & of body but of sound & perfect sense & memory thanks be to God for it; & calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortall life do make & ordain this to be my last will & Testament in manner & form following (that is to say) first I give & bequeath my soule into the hands of almighty God & Jesus Christ my redeemer by whos death & sufferings I hope for salvation; my body to the earth to be decently buryed at y^e discretion of my executors hereafter named & for all such worldly goods as God in his great favour hath bestowed on me I give in manner & form following — first I give & bequeath the plantation & all the land I now live on to my two sons Jacob & mathew to be equally divided between them my son Jacob to have the south part & my son mathew to have the north part to them & their heirs for ever; — I then I give & bequeath y^e plantation & land that I bought of Peter Dolly to my son Henry & his heirs for ever — I I give & bequeath my land in y^e swamp being one hundred & twelve acres to be equally divided between my three sons Jacob Henry & mathew to them & their heirs for ever; — I I give & bequeath to my son Jacob my negro man Robin to him & his heirs; I I give & bequeath to my son mathew my negro woman Rose to him & y^e heirs lawfully begotten of his body; I I give & bequeath to my son Henry my negro boy Beson to him & his heirs — I I give & bequeath to my daughter martha my negro wench moll to her & y^e heirs lawfully begotten of her body; I I give & bequeath to my said daughter martha my negro wench Tommy to her & her heirs; I I give & bequeath to my son John my negro called Tim ber neck & my negro man Sam to him & his heirs for ever; — I I give & bequeath to my daughter mary my negro girl Bab to her & to the heirs lawfully begotten of her body; — I I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah my negro girl Pitt to her & to the heirs lawfully begotten of her body; — I I give & bequeath to my three youngest children mathew mary & Sarah my negro girl Sarah to be equally divided between them when the youngest of them shall attain to y^e age of sixteen years to them & their heirs; — I I give & bequeath to my daughter martha forty pounds to be paid out of my estate in pork or wax or Tallow towards her keeping & schooling
