In the Name of God Amen this 22 Day of March in the year of our Lord God 1733
William Gibson of the County of Prince George being very sick & weak but of perfect
mind & memory his last will & testament is as follows
I do hereby give & bequeath unto my loving son
James Gibson my plantation in muddy Creek to him his heirs and
assigns two cows & calves two ewes & lambs three sow pigs one large and one
small powder dish & three plates one gun forty shillings in Cash and tabs for himself
at the age of 18 I do hereby give & bequeath unto my loving daughter Jane Gibson one cow
one calf one ewe one lamb one large and one small powder dish
and three plates one gun forty shillings in Cash - I do hereby give & bequeath unto my
beloved wife Mary Gibson all the rest of my Estate both real & personal making
her my sole executrix of this my last will & testament abjuring & disavowing
all former wills made by me made heretofore In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal the day & year first above written
