This Indenture made this twenty ninth Day of June in the year of Our Lord Christ One thousand Seven hundred and fifty three thousand Between Samuel Whitchurst of the County of Worcester owner of the one part & Malachie Nicholson of the same place of the other Part Whitchurst that the said Malachie Whitchurst hath given granted and by these presents doth grant unto the said Malachie Nicholson his heirs and assigns forever all that piece or Plantation of Land wherein he the said Tom Whitchurst now liveth lying and being in the Parish of Lyng haven & County afterwards containing One hundred and forty acres to the same more or less Beginning at the North East part of the said Land being the end of East Antho Walker Line & then running along East Antho Walker Line to a corner Tree standing in Richard Whitchursts Line thence along the said Richard Whitchursts Line & Garconry Whitchursts Line down to a marked Ash standing in a row thence along the same dividing this Land from the Land of Edward Son by David H. Glanchar called Hilldams down to the main Branch of Elizabeth River thence up the said Branch by the Landing called Whitchurst Landing according to the Meanders thereof up to the first beginning Station to have & to hold the said piece parcel or Plantation of Land together with all Woods underwoods Water Courses Landings & profits communitie there dments and appurtenances whatsoever belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same unto the said Malachie Nicholson his heirs and assigns forever in Exchange for One hundred and Seventy five acres of Land more or less calls formerly by the Name of the Ham in respect it being the one half of the same Land that William Nicholson by his Last Will and Testament bequeathed to his two sons George Nicholson & Samuel
