Current money of Virginia in Writings whereof both Parties hath accounts in
their hands and signed their seals this 17 Day of October and the Year above
written

In the Name of God Amen the 3 Day of March 1753 I William Healing
the Clerk of Prince Georges County being very Sick and Weak in Body but of
perfect mind and memory make be to God &c Improvising I give & bequeath
to my Son William one Negro Man called Jack & a feather bed & furniture which
he hath already received & one Walnut Table which he hath already received &
give likewise to my Son William my Sword and Great glass not moving the
Slave out of the house. During my Wife's Life to him and his heirs for ever
I give and bequeath to my Son William my Plantation and houses wherein I
now live & fifty Acres lying in the hill to being Swamp he no ways mis-
healing his Mother During her Natural Life to him and his heirs for ever
I give and bequeath to my Son John one Negro called Frances all the parcel & one
feather bed and furniture which he hath already received Likewise I give to my
Son John my Pistols and holsters to him and his heirs for ever I give and be-
queath to my Daughter Francis Smith one Negro Woman called Kate and
all her Increase & a feather bed and furniture which she hath already received to
her and her heirs for ever I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth the
renowned one Negro called Sarah and all her Increase and a feather bed and fur-
niture which she hath already received to her and her heirs for ever I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Mary one Negro girl called Phillis and all her in-
crease and my best Oval Table & a small looking Glass and a feather bed and
furniture and a window to her and her heirs for ever I give and bequeath to my
Son Henry one Negro boy called Frank & my New Desk and Gun and a feather
bed and furniture & fifty Acres of Land lying in the Swamp near the bridge
run to him and his heirs for ever I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mar-
gret one Negro boy called Hester & a Negro Girl called Nan & all her increase
and a cow and calf that is called here to her and her heirs for ever I give
and bequeath to my Daughter Anna one Negro Boy called Nicholas and one
Negro Girl called Liddy and all her Increase and a cow and calf which is

called here to her and her heirs for ever. I give and bequeath unto my said son John and Henry all my Carolina Possessions to be equally divided among them to them and their heirs for ever. I give and bequeath to my two Grand Children William and Mary all my good One Negro Slave called James the use of her to them and their heirs for ever & also one bed and some furniture which the said John Thoroughgood has got in his possession already to them and their heirs for ever. I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife my One Negro Man called Harry and a Negro Wench called Hope & all the Remainder and part of my Estate she paying my just Debts during her Natural Life and after her Death to be equally divided among all my Children I do appoint by Statute & Ordain my son William Theling Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. Reserving all other Wills and Testaments In Witness hereof I have set my hand and fixed my Seal this 3 day of March 1753

At a Court held the 20th March 1753 The within Last Will and Testament of Cap^t William Theling deceased was presented in Court by his Ex^r who made oath thereto & being proved by the Oaths of William Cympson and W^m Cox Witnesses thereto is admitted to record -

In the Name of God Amen I Robert Martin dale of the County of Prince George in the Colony of Virg^a being sick and weak of Body but of sound mind and perfect Memory &c do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following. to witz. Impairing I will and Devise that all Lands lying in York Town being one there which I thought of giving to my said Son with the Appurtenances thereto belonging to be sold by my Ex^r and also what Goods and Effects I do possess of or which shall belong to me at that Time for the most that can be had for the same in money. I give and bequeath unto M^r James Pastore of Norfolk County whatsoever shall be due from the said Pastore to me, at my Decease provided the said James Pastore will give and Execute to my Ex^r a General Release of all Claims and Demands whatsoever which the said James Pastore may or might have against my Estate. Item I give and bequeath unto my Brothers and Sisters, to witz John Martin dale of Wilmington at Cape Fear in North Carolina William Martin dale Elizabeth Todd Jane Barnes and Mary Saul of Cumberland Land in the Kingdom of Great Britain after my Debts and funeral Charges are paid and satisfied the Money which the said Lands and Appurtenances Goods and Effects above mentioned shall be sold for, and what other Estate of what Nature or Quality is now (not already disposed of) which I shall die seized or possessed of, to be equally divided among them, to them and their heirs for ever and in lease any of my Brothers or Sisters be dead at the Time of my Decease then I give the Part of such Person so deceased unto his or her Children And Lastly I make and Ordain M^r Edward Hack Mosely of said County of Prince George my whole and sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, making void all other and former Wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 17th Day of Jan^y 1753
