fourteen William Martin being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God
for his calling unto me & mortality of my body yet knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die & to come to
this my last will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God that
gave it & for my body I commend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my
nothing doubting but at the resurrection I shall receive it & stand again by the mighty power of God: and as touching
such worldly estate whoso with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & devise to dispose of as follows
main part of my last will to be paid. I give my plantation and all my land to Congregate unto my son Henry
Martin during his life and after his decease to my grand son William Martin & if my grand son is without issue
I give the portion of his body I give all my land to my grand daughter Ann Martin & her heirs I give my grand son pri-
vilege to build and live upon my manured plantation when he comes of age with the benefit of half my orchard & if my
son Henry Martin die before my grand son comes of age I bequeath at a great right to my son William Martin the
benefit of a fishing & I do bequeath to him all of timber excepting for my plantation & I give to my grand son
William Martin a piece of mill to use a lot of iron wedges and a grindstone after his father & mother I bequeath
two when he comes to the age of twelve years and a table for a chest & bed & reasoning that is now standing in my
living house & two powder dishes one tawdry and one pot & two boxes when he comes to the age of sixteen years
I give to my grand daughter Ann Martin a couch & a couch bed & a chest & a box two powder dishes two plates & a
candlestick & a lamp and a pot & a salt cellar two powder boxes when she comes to the age of sixteen years
when she comes to the age of twelve years also four powder spoons and a box when she comes to twelve years of
age I give to my grand daughter Deborah Martin two powder dishes & a chest & a box I give to my grand
daughter Ann Martin a silver mirror & a glass I give my said grand daughter privilege to live upon my
plantation as long as she lives single I give unto my grand son & grand daughter Ann Martin all the
uncut of my two cows & a horse that they shall bring between this & that time that they come of age & I have
divided between them and between me & I have of my said land that they bring between this & that time that they

Come of age to be Equally Divided betwixt them my son Henry master Diob's for his wife & give her power
 of attorney during her lifetime I constitute and ordain my son Henry master executor of this
 last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disavow & disannul all other Testaments wills
 Legacies requests and Executors by me in any way so before this time named with & by me this ratifying and
 confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and Seal of Day and year above written

In the Name of God Amen & thirtieth day of march one thousand seven hundred & eighteen John woodhouse
 of county of prince george being sick & weak of body but of sound & perfect mind & uncertain estate of this transitory life Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament (as well as all other)
 in manner following first I bequeath my soul unto almighty God who gave it me and my body to be buried
 decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named

I give unto my son Horatia & my Daughter Mary my four negroes to wit Edger bay James and young Mary to be
 equally shared & divided between them when they shall come to 4 years after specified (viz) my son to have his share
 when he comes to eight or nine years of age & my Daughter to have her share & equal proportion of 4 said four negroes at
 age of six teen in & mean time my will & desire is that my negroes remain on my plantation as formerly

I give unto my Daughter an gold ring with feather bed that lies in high headboard with rugg blanket bolster
 and bedstead to be given to her when she comes to 4 years above mentioned. It I give unto my son a feather bed a
 rugg blanket sheet & bedstead I now live on when he comes to 4 years of eight or nine years. It I give unto my son four silver
 spoons & my oval table at 4 years above mentioned and to my Daughter and last said son also my four pots
 and a table I give to my son & Daughter to be divided between them at the ages above mentioned

And I do hereby Nominate my beloved brother Capt. Horatia woodhouse to be Executor of this my last will & Testa-
 ment & to be our son to do this my will duly & truly performed and that he in all things perform my duty of executor
 and all rest remainder & residue of my personal estate I order them to pay unto my just and lawful Debtors when
