after my just debts & funeral expences are abated to be equally divided amongst & between my
wife & children to whom I give & leave my will & desire is that all my plate be equally divided
between my wife & children or the survivors of them when my Eldest Son shall come of age which
plate I give to my said wife & children to be divided as aforesaid. — I Do hereby nominate & appoint
my Dear wife Katherine Walke & my Loving brother Anthony Walke to be Exors of this my Last
will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal y^e 22: Day of March

poor condition of body but of sound disposing mind & memory thank be to almighty God for it, have
soe laid & comitted to me my last will in manner following: — I do dedicate my soul to almighty
God my great good & true hoping & trusting in through his almighty merits of Jesus Christ my Lord & Saviour I
herein make & ordain of all my last & dying will & direction at yester Day casting my worldly Estate I
doe leave to my former wife — first & I doe appoint that all my just debts be paid and I do
charge & command my said wife to pay to my son Edward belonging unto my son
Edward Thorogood to his heirs for ever, alwayes excepting part of his estate the wof and
my loving wife during her natural life — my will desires what else & money I have
now in the world to be laid out by my executors after reasonable & young wage which no one
whom purfesse I give unto my daughter Mary Thorogood to her the heirs for ever to be and
to keep her in her proper place until her marriage being about Seven hundred pounds

I give unto my son Adam Thorowgood & to his heirs for ever my negro maid servant Jane
the Labour & service of her to my loving wife during her widow hood — I give unto my son Adam
now good my negro woman called Nancy to him & his heirs for ever — I give to my loving wife
two slaves with & her other slaves for ever — I give unto my Son Adam Thorowgood one
young bay mare about four years old to him & his heirs — my will & desire is so hereby made
to appoint that all my Stock of cattle & horses be InVENTORY & according to their quantity & quality
be Equally divided among them between my wife & children to whom I give & leave I give unto
my Son Adam Thorowgood my Trooping saddle pistol holsters & sword belt with my gun to him and
his heirs forever — my will & desire is so hereby made that all goods & residue & remainder
of my Estate of what nature or quality so ever not otherwise disposed of be appraised after all
just debts & funeral expenses abated & same be Equally divided between my wife & children to
whom I give & leave to their heirs for ever — Lastly I now make & appoint my Loving wife
Patience Thorowgood & my Heirman Mr Tho: Thorowgood to be executors of this my last will & Testament
