76 Sisters Children that shall be then living at the time of my said Sister her Death. Item I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife Elizabeth Thoroughgood my Negro Girl Jenny to her and her Heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Nephew John Nimmo my Negro man Slave named Caesar to him and his Heirs for ever. I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth Nimmo my old Negro Man named Rose, to her and her Heirs for ever. Item, after my just debts are paid, I give and bequeath the remainder of my personal Estate, to my said beloved wife and her Heirs for ever. Lastly. I nominate and appoint my beloved Friends, my brother in law m^r James Nimmo, and Capt. Samuel Thoroughgood Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof, I the said William Thoroughgood Junr, have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this seventh day of October Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and Seventy nine.
