sold and the money arising from my Horse to be
given to my wife to by another and if my Wife should
marry then the one half of my Estate to be equally
divided amongst all my Children and at her death
the remainder of it to be divided as before after my
Lawfull debts are first paid out of it.

I do Appoint my beloved Wife with James Wright
my Brother to be my Whole Executors and Executors
to this my last will by me made Defaulding and
Revoking all other Wills by me made Witness my
hand and Seal this 29 day of August 1775
