of the year of our Lord 1732

In the Name of God Amen the thirty day of November in the year of our Lord 1732
 I William Whitthurst son of princis Ann County being in perfect senses and sound
 memory praised be god for it calling to mind the mortality of my body being
 very sick & weak do make & ordains this my last will & Testament that is to
 say principally and first of all I give an recomond my soule into the hands of God
 that gaoit and for my body I commond it to the earth to be buryed in a Christian
 like & Decent manner at the discretion of my Exccutor and as Touching my
 worldly goods I give & dismiss and Disposs of the same in the following manner
 and form: — I do give & bequeath unto my loving son arthur whitthurst
 this hoirs and assigns for ever on shalf of my Tract of Land wher on I now
 live it being the parts wher on my house & plantation is on his mother fawing
 thows thereof during her natural life I also give him one Cow and Cow
 calf and two ewes and Lambs to be delivered to him when he shall come to age
 I do give & bequeath to my loving son Odin whitthurst one young cow and calf
 and two ewes & lambs I also give him fourty pounds of feathers those things to be
 delivered immediately after my decease I also give to my son Odin the other half of my
 Land wher on I live it being the part wher on he lives I give the same to him &
 his hoirs for ever — I do give and bequeath to my loving daughter megrit
 wright one hoifer yearling to be delivered immediately after my decease. — I do
 give & bequeath to my grandson arthur daniels one hoifer yearling to be delivered
 to him immediately after my decease. — I do give & bequeath to my loving daughter
 Bridget daniels one young cow & calf & one ewe & lamb to be delivered to her im-
 mediately after my decease I do give & bequeath to my loving son Chas: whitthurst
 and this hoirs & assigns for ever one hundred & fifty acres of land it being parts
 of 1/2 land I bought of the two Thomas Carroway it being that part lay nearest
 to Bourings river but if he dy thonte I do give him one young cow & calf
 one ewe & lamb & one sow & piggs to be delivered to him when he shall come to age
 I do give & bequeath to my loving son Francis whitthurst this hoirs for ever

one negro boy named George my wife having the use of him during her Natural
 life. — I then I give & bequeath to my loving son willis whithurst one boy
 named Coker to him & his heirs for ever my wife having the use of him during her
 Natural life. — I then I give & bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth whom
 I likewise constitute make & ordain my only & sole Ex^{or} of this my last will & Testament
 all & singular all the remainde of my movable estate during her naturall life
 to have the use thereof and then at her death to be equally divided amongs all my
 children living on this west side of y^e. I profess wamp & do hereby utterly disallow
 revoke & disanul all & every other former Testaments wills Legacies requests Ex^{or}
 by me in any ways before this time named wills & bequeathed ratifying & confirming
 this no: other to be my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have runte to
 my hand & seals the day and year above writton

Princess Ann: At a Court hold^e y^e 7th of Feb^r. 1732
 Then the above last will & Testament of William
 whithurst deceased was read in Court by Elizabeth
 whithurst his Ex^{or} who made oath thereto & being
 proved by the oaths of both y^e witnesses thereto is admitted to Record

This Indenture made the thirty first day of January in the year of our Lords
 one thousand seven hundred & thirty two. Between Henry Simmons of prince
 anne county & precinct of Blackwater & Sarah his wife of the one party & John Corprow
 of Norfolk County in Virginia of the other part witnesseth that y^e said Henry
 & Sarah for their satisfaction of y^e sum of five shillings of lawfull money of
 Virginia to them in hand paid by the said John Corprow: Receipt whereof he
 doth hereby acknowledge with bargain & sold by the said presents doth bargain &
 sell unto y^e said John Corprow one tract or parcel of land by Estomation twenty
 acres of land more or less according to the bounds mentioned in the lease from
 Thomas Smyth to y^e said Henry Simmons as p^r. the records of princess anne relation
 thereunto being had may appear with y^e reversion & reversions of y^e said land
 & hereditament & premises with y^e appurtenances To Have and To Hold the said
 land & hereditament by premises unto y^e said John Corprow his heirs Ex^{ors} admors &
 assigns for & during the term of one whole year next ensuing y^e date hereof to
