In the Name of God Amen the thirty day of November in the year of our Lord 1733 1/2
 I William Whitthurst son of prince Anne County being in perfect senses and sound
 memory praised be God for it calling to mind the mortality of my body being
 very sick & weak do make & ordains this my last will & Testament that is to
 say principally and first of all I give & recomend my soule into the hands of God
 that gave it and for my body I comend it to the earth to be buryed in a chrestian
 like & decent manner at the discretion of my Exccutor and as Touching my
 worldly goods I give & dismiss and Dispose of the same in the following manner
 and form: — I do give & bequeath unto my loving son Arthur Whitthurst
 this hoire and assigns for ever on shalf of my Tract of Land whereon I now
 live it being the parts whereon my house & plantation is on his mother having
 thows thereof during her natural life I also give him one cow and cow
 calf and two ewes and lambs to be delivered to him when he shall come to age
 I do give & bequeath to my loving son Odier Whitthurst one young cow and calf
 and two ewes & lambs I also give him forty pounds of feathers these things to be
 delivered immediately after my decess I also give to my son Odier the other half of my
 Land whereon I live it being the part whereon he lives I give the same to him &
 his heirs for ever — I do give and bequeath to my loving daughter Margaret
 Wright one hoifer yearling to be delivered immediately after my decess. — I do
 give & bequeath to my grandson Arthur Lamont one hoifer yearling to be delivered
 to him immediately after my decess. — I do give & bequeath to my loving Daughter
 Bridget Nail one young cow & calf & one ewe & lamb to be delivered to her immediately
 after my decess I do give & bequeath to my loving son Chas: Whitthurst
 and his heirs & assigns for ever one hundred & fifty acres of land it being parts
 of a Land I bought of the two Thomas Carroway it being that part lying nearest
 to Bourne's river but if he dy thouto before I also give him one young cow & calf
 one ewe & lamb & one sow & piggs to be delivered to him when he shall come to age
 I do give & bequeath to my loving son Francis Whitthurst this hoire for ever

one negro boy named George my wife having the use of him during her Natural
life. — I then I give & bequeath to my loving son willis whephurst one negro boy
named Coker to him & his heirs for ever my wife having the use of him during her
Natural life. — I then I give & bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth whom
I likewise constitute make & ordain my only & sole Ex^{or} of this my last will & Testament
all & singular all the remainds of my movable estate during her naturall life
to have the use thereof and then at her death to be equally divided amongs all my
children living on this west side of y^e. I profess wamp & do hereby utterly disallow
revoke & disannul all & every other former Testaments wills Legacies requests Ex^{ors}
by me in any ways before this time named willis & bequeathed ratifying & confirming
this to be no other to be my last will & Testament in witness whereof I hereunto set
my hand & seals the day and year above written

Then the above last will & Testament of William
Whithurst do was read in Court by Elizabeth
Whithurst his Ex^{or} who made oath thereto & being
proved by the oaths of both y^e witnesses thereto is admitted to Record

This Indenture made the thirty first day of January in the year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred & thirty two. Between Henry Simmons of prince
ann county & precinct of Blackwater & Sarah his wife of the one party & John Corprow
of Norfolk County in Virginia of the other part witnesseth that y^e said Henry
& Sarah for the satisfaction of y^e sum of five shillings of lawfull money of
Virginia to him in hand paid by the said John Corprow y^e receipt whereof he
do hereby acknowledge both bargain & sold by the said presents doth bargain &
sell unto y^e said John Corprow one tract or parcel of land by Estomation twenty
acres of land more or less according to the bounds mentioned in the lease from
Thomas Smyth to y^e said Henry Simmons as p^d the records of princess anne rotation
whereunto being had may appear with y^e reversion & reversions of y^e said land
to y^e said John Corprow & his heirs forever with y^e appurtenances To Have and To Hold the said
land Tenement & premises unto y^e said John Corprow his heirs Ex^{ors} admors &
assigns for & during the term of one whole year next ensuing y^e date hereof to
