one narrow & five Bushels Wheat
one pitcher and one plow & harrow
Fifty sheaves of Flax & one Mare called
Two cows & Yearlings Five hogs & Chick
of Hogs and one Wading hoe I give all
those Articles within mentioned to my
beloved Wife during her natural life
I give unto my Friend William
and his heirs two Barrels of Corn to him
part to my Estate I leave to be sold at
Publick Sale by my Executors both
within doors and without to pay off my
Lawful Debts and to perform my

Funeral in a Christian manner the
Remainder of the Money my Will and
Desires that my Son Henry Turner sh
uld have it I give it to him and his heirs
forever; And lastly constitute and
appoint my loving Wife Mary Turner
and my Friend William Brock to be my
whole and sole Executors of the my last
Will and Testament Reserving full
power against all other Wills for the same
