In the Name of God Amen y^e 6 Day of February in the Year of Our Lord 1763 I Christopher Thelpot Sea I give and bequath to my daughter Elisabeth all my Lands to her and the heirs of her Body Lawful by begetten and my Will and Desier is that if my Daughter die without such heir that the said Lands shall descend to Rachel West and her heirs I also give to my Daughter one good fether bed and furnished and also one new and one pair of Wellstones and all my Iron Tools of all kind I give & bequath to Rachel West the first fold that my Man shall bring I give and bequath to my true and well beloved Wife Mary all the Remainder of my Estate During her Widowhood only my Horse shodden and my Will and desier is that my Daughter should have the said Horse when ever she comes of Age and do appoint my Wife Mary to be my true and law ful Executor denying all other Will or Wills in forever do ordain this my last Will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year first above written

In the Name of God amen I Worsell Alderson of Princeps Anne County being sick and weak &c. I. I give and bequath to my Son John Alderson my Spoon on which one bay Mare called Primus and one and half called sweet lips one Iron Spade holds about Six Shillings one Iron Hovel and Large Chest called mine and all my wearing Cloaths to him and his heirs for ever I give & bequath all the Remainder of my Estate my just debt being first satisfied and paid to be equally divided between my Wife & all my Children to them and their heirs forever Lastly I nominate and appoints Arth^r Langer Exor of this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12 day of August 1752
