be to god for the same and calling to remembrance the uncertainty
of this present life and that all women are born once to die.
I do hereby make constitute appoint this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following, first and
principally I recommend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God and hoping the bitter death of my Saviour
Jesus Christ to inherit everlasting life and my body I
Commit to the earth to be decently Interid and buried at
the discretion of my executor hereafter named and
touching such Temporal estate, I give and bequeath to my
son James Leatherland one featherbed Cow and Calf two young
Stears two year old and one stear four year old and heffer
and one young mare and one pewter dish & three pewter

As to my trust to inherit everlasting life and my body I do
Commit to the earth to be decently Interred and buried at
the discretion of my executor hereafter named and
touching such Temporal estate, I give and bequeath to my
son James Leatherland one featherbed Cow and Calf two young
Stears two year old and one stear four year old and heffer
and one young mare and one pewter dish & three pewter
plates and one Iron pot. Item I give and bequeath all and
singular my estate both real and personal household stuff
and Implements of houshold Cattle and hogs and mar's
and Moveables whatsoever I am owner of in this world
unto my son William Murphy David Maccoll
I give and bequeath unto my son William Murphy
untill next october Ensuung and then to be set free if he
Acquits his freedom dues for the time that he has given
him which is eight months; I say I do make my son

William Murphy my whole executor he paying all
such debts as shall justly appear due from my estate In
Witness whereof I have set my hand and seal
