

In the Name of God Amen

On the fourth Day of October Anno Domini 1736. I Daniel Oriar of the County of Prince William and Colony of Virg. being a very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind & memory thank be given unto God therofore calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament. That is to say principally & first of all I give & bequeath my Soul into the hands of God that gave it & for my Body I bequeath it to the Earth to be buried in a Christianlike & decent manner at ye discretion of my Executors Whome hereafter I shall Appoint nothing doubting but at ye General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God. And as touching my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life after my just debts and funeral Expences are paid I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner. To wit

Item I give & bequeath to my loving Son John Oriar that part of my Land lying & being betwixt on the North Side of Goose Run & the South Side of the County Road to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my loving Son Daniel Oriar my Plantation wherupon I now live with the remainder of my Land lying and being between the North side of the County Road & the South side of

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pounds are paid I Give and bequeath the sum of the same in the following manner to my Son Viz

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Son John Orrar that part of my Land lying & being betw^o on the North Side of Goose Run & the South Side of the County Road to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Son Daniel Orrar my Plantation whereon I now live with the remainder of my Land lying and being betw^o on the North side of the County Road and the South side of Dorsets run to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Son John Orrar One young Cow & Calf, one three years old Mare, one three Gallons Iron Pott, two Powdered Basons, one Gallon three ^{new} Powdered Plates to be delivered when he arrives to the Age of twenty one years

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Son Daniel Orrar One young Cow & Calf one three years old Mare, one four Gallons Iron Pott, one new Powdered Bason, one new Silver Powder Dish three new Powdered Plates to be delivered when he arrives to the Age of twenty one years

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Wife Esther Orrar -

all the rest of my Estate (not before Wills or named) And further
 my Will and desire is that my two sons John & Daniel Oriers
 before named have each of them two years schooling. & I likewise
 do institute make & ordain my dear & beloved Wife my
 Mother in Law William Thorn & my Brother John Oriar my
 only & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament & I do hereby
 utterly disallow revoke & disannul all & every other former Testaments
 Wills & Legacies Bequests and Executors by me in any ways before
 this time made Will & Bequeathed & my Will & desire is that
 my Estate be not Appraised but that all the Legacies be delivered
 in kind as they are mentioned Ratifying & confirming this & no
 other to be my Last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have
