 of Francis Aubrey of the parish of Truro of the County of Prince William of the
 Colony of Virginia being very sick and weak but of perfect mind & memory do first
 of all beseeche my soul to Almighty God that gave it my body to this earth from
 whence it came to be buried in such decent manner as my Executors shall think
 proper.

I have given to my loving wife all my now dwelling plantations which from two years
 past during her natural life or best bed & furniture and herofall'd Huzzoy &
 furniture three thousand weight of Tobacco yearly every year during her
 natural life or widowhood or day of marriage also one negrowoman called Bess
 and negrobey called Cuff during her natural life or widowhood or day of
 marriage like wife and Servant man called Jacob Delfour & to give her said
 Servant man one year of his time if desiring of it my will and desire is that
 my three children may be under the care of my loving wife until the day of
 her death or day of marriage to her husband.

the death or day of marriage that is to say Sarah, George & Daniel which
is today during her natural life or day of marriage my will and desire is that
if my wife dies or marries that my daughter Sarah be under his care of my —
Daughter Elizabeth Newland & son George to his care of my son Edward —
Livery & my son Edward to his care of his grandfather Cap't Benjamin Reynolds
until they be of age.

Item I give to my son John all that Tract of Land he now lives upon —
I now give all that Tract of Land at Kidfalls where Pontney lives upon —
Except fifty acres where his ferry ordinary is kept & one hundred acres of
Land about Goof Brook which was bought of William Perry like wise &
his Stock & household goods which is now in his possession & shall be.

Item I give my son Francis all that tract of Land he now lives upon at —
Pontney together with all his Stock & household goods now in his possession
falls his.

Daughter Elizabeth nowward & son George to his care of my Son Edward
Ludlowe my Son I am set to his care of his godfathers Capt Benjamin Grayson
until they be of age.

Item I give to my Son John all that Tract of Land he now lives upon &
likewise all that Tract of Land at the falls where Pontney dwells upon
except fifty acres where the ferry ordinary is kept and hundred acres of
Land above Goolebrook which was bought of William Perry likewise all
the Stock & household goods which is now in his possession & let him. 95

Item I give my Son Francis all that tract of Land he now lives upon at
Pontney together with all the Stock & household goods now in his possession
all his.

Item I give my Son Richard that fifty acres of Land reserved at the falls
where the ferry and ordinary is kept likewise the half part of that tract
of Land lying upon four miles river joining to Chocorua & likewise that

Tract of Land where Samuel Hull now lies upon extending from
the beginning brook up the river one hundred yards above the ferry -

Landing one hundred yards above the said ferry road up to Sucklor
and so joining upon Sucklor down to Creek river

thus giving my son Thomas my son Samuel to be equally divided

all the Land above the Land bequeathed to Richard Avery upto -

Hector's Creek my son Thomas to have my now working plantations

thus giving to my son Horner the half part of that tract of Land -

reserved upon four miles river joining to Alexander Falloping River

the half part of a Tract of Land containing 762 acres hundred -

bearing date February the 12: 1739 joining to the Land of Captain

and his Plantations where George Williams formerly lived thus

the other part of that tract of Land containing 762 acres given to

my son George joining upon Potowack river with his plantation -

improvements they're withouts where Andrew Greenbone now -

Lives upon

I have given to my daughter Elizabeth Norland all that tract
of Land lying upon Turkeycoras which I bought of George Rayton
tutor and his heirs after his body lawfully begotten for ever & for
want of such heirs to his heirs at Law.

I have given to my daughter Sarah all that Tract of Land where
Johnsons Quarters now lies extending as far as his three
white oaks being Turkeycoras corners tutor and his heirs for ever
and for want of such heirs to his heirs at Law and if it should so
happen that the said Aubrey should obtain deeds or grants from
the Land office in Maryland for any sum or sums of Land over
the main or islands my will is and I equally beseeche all his said
lands to my five sons them and their heirs for ever they being
at equal Exposures in plaining of the land. I do this the 18th of June

of land lying upon Tuckforora which I bought of George Taylor
tutors and his heirs after my death lawfully begotten for over & for
want of such heirs to his tutor at law.

Then I give to my daughter Sarah all that Tract of Land where
Jonathan Richardson now lives extending as far as his three
white oaks being Tuckforo's corners tutors and his heirs for over
and for want of such heirs to his tutor at law and if it should so
happen that his said Aubrey should obtain deeds or grants from
the Land office in Maryland for any sum or sums of Land over
the main or affords my will is and I equally bequeath all his said
lands to my five Sons them and their heirs for ever they being
at equal expence in clearing of his land which is to say that his
money may immediately pay him for clearing of his land.

Maryland & to be equally divided between my Son Thomas Richard &
Henry George & Samuel.

Item I give to my son Thomas two of the Scotch hands namely Williams &
Fraffor & John Davison, he having the liberty to do at his pleasure any of my
Land during his mother's life & likewise give him one negro boy named
Sammy.

Item I give to my son Richard two negroes namely old Buff & Ningo
Item I give to my son Henry two negroes namely Jack & Tommy
Item I give to my son George ~~one~~ negro follows namely Ned and his
daughter Little Bess after his mother's decease or day of marriage.

Item I give to my son Samuel one negro woman called great Bess and one
negro boy called Buff after his mother's decease or day of marriage.

Item I give to my daughter Sarah one negro girl named Timmy.

Item my will and desire is I have 420 acres of land upon the Branches of
Bottom and 400 which I have a warrant for I have had it Surveyed and
I expect a deed upon the Branches of Clerks runnig

Expect a deed upon the Branches of Clerks runs joining to Richard Roberts
as also another piece of land lying in W. Mary land over the bay purchased
by the said Ambrey of Peter Froom and Elizabeth his wife for two
hundred acres more or less which three several tracts of land I do give
be sold to Robert and highest bidder and the money so raised summa
as may convenient to be applied to my debts and the overspence the money
to be laid out in negroes and applied to the use of the children that is to
say Richard Henry George Samuel and my daughter Sarah, it is
likewise my will and desire that Thomas Ambrey have fifty pounds
reserved out of the price of the three tracts of land to buy him two
negroes my will is that this said Thomas Ambrey sets account and
receives with every body in the behalf of me and for his so doing for any
trouble shall have full commission my will is that all my personal
estate be equally divided between my wife and six children namely

to be sold to the best and highest bidder and the money so raised so much
as may convenient to be applied to my debts and the overplus the money

so laid out in negroes and applied to the use of his children that is to -

Say Richard Henry George Samuel and my daughter Sarah it is -

Likewise my will and desire that Thomas Aubrey have fifty pounds -

reserved out of the price of the three tracts of Land to buy two

negroes my will is that his said Thomas Aubrey settle accounts and -

divide with every body in the behalf of me and for his so doing for his -

trouble shall have full commission my will is that all my personal

Estate be Equally divided between my wife and his Children namely

Thomas Richard Honorey George Samuel my Daughter Sarah my

will and desire is that if the above written three Tracts of Land which

I should not hold out to pay my Debts and to set Thomas Aubrey

Leave fifty pounds that he or the money left more than will pay my
 debts to be equally divided between the two children that is to say —
 Thomas Richard Hornery George Samuel Dury daughter Sarah
 & him my son Thomas to have instead of the fifty pounds negro
 Butchers and negro George Except Philip Newland pays the money
 to Thomas Aubrey which I have paid to clear the Estate of John
 Neal deceased.

And Lastly I ordain and appoint John Aubrey Thomas Aubrey —
 Richard Aubrey to be my whole and sole Executors of this my last
 Will & Testament that is John Aubrey & Thomas Aubrey shall —
 every six months declare upon oath to the Court of the Probate
 Division of the Estates for the satisfactions of Richard Aubrey —
 until he shall be of age.

Acknowledging this to be my last Will and Testament above —

knowing and attesting Disavowing all others who formerly signed
made and Desiring this only to be my Last Will & Testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
Seal this 14 day of December 1741.

This last will and Testament of Francis Aubrey gent deceased was proved by
the oaths of Samuel Full & James Hobson two of the witnesses thereto &
Admitted to record. Execution of John Aubrey Thomas Aubrey & Richard
Aubrey Esq. their names and theirs performing what is usual in such cases
Certificate was granted them for obtaining a probate hereof in due form.

Know all men by these presents that we John Aubrey Thomas —
Aubrey. Richard Aubrey Stephanus Wade John Sturman Edward Evans —
John Wotton John Evans & David Robertson recd & for us & our heirs unto
William Fairfax Esq: first Justice in his commission of the peace for Prince William
County for and in behalf of the said Justices & proof of the suffices of the said County
and their successors in the sum of two thousand pounds sterling to be paid to the
said William Fairfax his executors admt & his legatees to his testate payment
well and truly to be made & given & our heirs and every of us our executors or

well and truly to send and deliver our saids and every one of us our property or our
lives, Executors and jointly severally firmly by these presents sealed
with our seals dated the 24 day of March 1741.

The condition of this obligation is such that if the above named John Thomas
and Richard Wooley Esq; of this last will & Testament of Francis Wooley esq; late -
Died leaving or gave to his wife a true and perfect inventory of all and singular
his goods (cattels & credits of his said Deed which have or shall come to his
hands possession or knowledge of his said sons John & Richard or into his
hands or possession of any other person or persons for them to have & to do -
and to exhibit (as to be exhibited) into his County (Court of Prince Edward)
at such time as they shall be demanded required by his said Court or the same -
goods (cattels & credits called other his goods (cattels & credits of his said -
Deed at the time of his Death or which at any time after shall come to
the hands or possession of the said John Thomas & Richard or into his
hands or possession of any other person or persons for them to have &

Died somwhere (and) took and had a true and perfect inventory of all and singular
hath goods (Cattels & Credits of his said Deed which have or shall (and to his)
hands, possession or knowledge of his said sonne Thomas & Richard & unto his
hands or possession of any other person or persons for them to have and to
ward & distributor (and) to be paid into his County (Court of Prince of Wales)
at such time as they shall be demanded required by his said Court of the same —
goods (Cattels & Credits called other his goods (Cattels & Credits of his said
Deed at the time of his Death or which at any time after shall (and to
his hands or possession of his said sonne Thomas & Richard & unto his
hands or possession of any other person or persons for them to have and to
truly adjust according to law and further do make a just and true account
of their actions during his life, to be paid into required by his said Court
and also do with truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and
provided in his said Deed as farre as the said Goods (Cattels &

to do to him to the intent and purpose above mentioned
the above obligation to be void of course & effect or otherwise full forced
by either.
