and Ordain this my Last will & Testament as followeth -
First and most principally I Give and Bequeath my Soul to
Almighty God who gave it first to me in hopes of a pardon of
all my Sins and his Gracious Acceptance thro the merits of
Jesus Christ and my Body I Command to the Earth to be
Decently Buried at the Direction of my Executors hereafter
Named and the wordly Goods it has pleased God to bestow upon
me after my just Debts & Funeral Expences are paid
I Give & Bequeath as followeth -

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Son Anthony Kitchen a Horse
and Saddle of about Ten pounds Value when he shall arrive
to the age of Eighteen years.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary
Overall Kitchen five Shillings Sterling & no more

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Daughter Jane a Bed and
Furniture to her & her heirs

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Loving wife Nancy
Kitchen all my Estate of what nature soever During
her widowhood and in case of her Marriage or at her Death
I Give & Bequeath all my Said Estate to be Equally Divided
Between my Son Anthony & Daughters Jane Elizabeth
Rebecca and Nancy and to their heirs forever

and Lastly I hereby nominate & appoint my Friends
William B Harrison and James Cwell Executors to

This my Last will & Testament revoking & Disannulling
all other wills by me made In Witness whereof I hereunto
