or piece of Land Situate lying and being at Occoquan to them

Current money of Virginia to be paid at the Decess of her Mother
by my Executors and as touching the Remainder of my personal
estate it is my desire that the same shall be equally divided among
my Children. And Lastly I do will and ordain my Dearly loved
wife Jane Reeve & my beloved Son William Executors of this my
last will and Testament. Revoking and Disannulling all
former wills heretofore made wherein to I have set my hand and Seal
The Eleventh day of March Anno Domini 1778.
