is that the £ 5000 my son Richard Wilson
twenty pounds lawful money I also give to my son Henry
that before which I bought of him. I give and bequeath
to my daughter Elizabeth Wiginton my negro
woman Pudd to her and her heirs forever I give

her. I then give and bequeath to my son Richard
Wilson the negro boy called Bob to him and his heirs forever.
I then give and bequeath to my son Henry Wilson
the negro man called Sam to him and his heirs forever.

In Consideration of the valuable benefit of the said my wife
is that the said Henry pay to my son Richard Wilson
twenty pounds lawful money I also give to my said son Henry
that before which I bought of him. I then give and bequeath
to my Daughter Elizabeth Wiginton my negro
woman Judd to her and her heirs forever. I then give and
bequeath to my Daughter Agatha Smith my negro girl called
Phillip to her and her heirs forever. I then give and
bequeath to my son James Wilson my negro boy Cusson to him and
his heirs forever also his choice of my horses and the grey
maids Colt. I then give and bequeath to Anne Calphers
that before which Calphers and her calf and twenty pounds

Careful money to be delivered and paid by my Executors immediately
Them I give and bequeath to Mary Holisfield the Negro
Child which ^{now} Lucie Judah and the House called Miller
My will further is that my plantation & Mill be sold in
the best manner & all the rest of my Estate after my son
Archibald has had one fourth part of the Tobacco now in the
House & one third of the ensuing years crop of Tobacco
and all the rest of my Estate to be sold as if (except the
negatives before mentioned) and the money equally divided
Among my said Child & my Debt is paid And
I do further appoint my son Henry Wilson and
Benjamin Wigginton Executors of my last will and
Testament signed sealed and confirmed in presence of
my will further is that my Debt be paid & the
fourth part of the Tobacco now on my plantation this year and
the next and the money to be paid to my son and me
in the best manner and manner which we will
and the said Henry Wilson and Benjamin Wigginton

that I am in good luck that the people of color I took
of my estate in my will. Population of the land is divided
and I am about to be left for their use and for the
use of the American Indians. I am standing by the rights of the
colored people of the State which is not a legacy and
my right of inheritance is that I may use it as I please. I have
without careful consideration the thing which is his part
mentioned in this will to be equally divided amongst the
children of my son and sister. I declare my will is
that my son Archibald Wilson have as fifth part of the
corn made this year on my plantation and the like of this
wheat &c. also and then my will is that after the legacy
and debts be settled and paid that then the rest of my
estate be sold as if to raise the money (equally divided among
my wife Chitown and to further appoint my son
Henry Wilson and Benjamin Wigginton Executors of
