In the Name of God Amen. I James Greshon of
Prince William County being sick and weak and of a perfect
and sound memory thanks be to almighty god for the same
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye do make

and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner
and form following that is to say first I bequeath my ~~and~~
soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and
my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion
of my Executor and Executrix hereafter named and as for
such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow upon
me I give in the following manner. Imprimis I give and
bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary Greshon and my
beloved Daughter Elizabeth Morris my whole estate to be
Equally divided between them Lastly I constitute and
appoint my beloved son in law Thomas Morris Executor
and my beloved Daughter Mary Greshon Executrix of this
my last will and testament revoking and annulling all
other wills by me made ratifying and Confirming this to
be my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have

set my hand and seal this 23. day of February 1743/4
