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Will of John Menden the fourth day of June
in the year of our Lord God 1735 I James Henderson in the
County of Prince William being very sick and weak in body
but of perfect mind & memory thanks be unto God therefore calling
to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that is appointed
for all men to dye Do make and Ordain this my last will
and Testament that is to say, principally and first of all I Give and
recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and for
my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian
like and Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing
doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate
whereunto it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I Give -
Bequeath and dispoſe of the same in the following manner and
form

In premises I Give my well beloved Friend Jeffery Johnson
whom I likewise constitute make and ordain my only and
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament all and singular
my moveables and Lands by him freely to be possessed and enjoyed
and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and Disannul all and
every other former Testaments Wills and Legacies Bequests and
Executors by me in any way before this time made
