Will.

In the name of God Amen, I Linnagh Helin of the
County of Prince William & State of Virginia being of
Sound mind & memory thanks be to God for the same but
Aware of the Mortality that flesh is hurst do constitute &
Appoint this my Last Will & Testament revoking all
former Wills, in manner & form following Viz: -
I Infirmly my Will & desire is that my beloved wife Kester
shall in lieu of her Dower during her natural life and
Subject to the encumbrances herein after mentioned hold &
Enjoy the plantation whereon I now live together with the Slaves
live Stock of all kinds furniture & all the Chattles that shall
be on the said plantation & in my possession at my Death

I devise to my Daughter Elizabeth Helme one
 negro girl named Penny also two hundred & fifty Pounds
 specie. I also confirm to my said Daughter the Gift I made
 her of a horse Saddle & Bridle & is my farther will and Desire
 that my said Daughter Elizabeth shall be maintained untill
 the Legacy is paid, out of the profits of the Estate bequeathed my
 wife Keeter, in the manner she has been accustomed to —
 I Item give and bequeath to my Daughter Celia wife of
 Doct^r George Graham fifty pounds or five thousand pound
 of bro^d Tob^o as shall appear to my Exors (herein after
 mentioned) to be most expedient, and do hereby confirm
 all gifts of Stock & other Gifts made to her hitherto —
 I Item give and bequeath unto my Grandson Lyna
 Roberts the sum of forty Pounds or four thousand

I give & bequeath unto my Grandsons Lyna
Kilbynght Lyna Helin Son of Thomas & Lyna Helin
Son of William the Sum of fifty Pounds Each or five
Thousand Pounds of Gaspetobacco as my Exors shall think
best. My Will is that the Legacy to my Daughters
Elizabeth & Felicia & Grand Sons above Mentioned Shall
be raised from the profits of the estate devised to my
Wife Hester together with my lawfull and Just Debts -
but should my beloved wife die before my Debts are paid
and the Legacies raised to my wish that the said
Estate devised to my wife shall be kept together by
my Exors untill they shall find it convenient

Witness my hand & seal this 10th day of March 1688

1780
I devise the said Plantation or tract of Land together
with a moiety of the Slaves Stock &c. that shall then belong to the
said Estate & all the Increase from the time of my death to my
son William the other moiety of the Slaves Stock &c. I devise
to my son Thomas Item I devise unto my son Thomas all
my Lands in Louquies lying on the south side of Cedar
Creek & do hereby confirm all gifts of Slaves & other Gifts
made to my said son Thomas during my life. Item I
do hereby confirm generally all gifts made to my sons and
Daughters in my life as the gifts were then made or
intended to be made. Lastly I do nominate & appoint
my beloved Wife Hester my Executors & my sons Thomas
and William Executors to this my Last Will & Testament. Signed
