Then I ~~Desire~~ Direct My Executors heirs after named to sell the Remainder of my personal Estate consisting of Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, a Schooner Boat, My Household Furniture not Belonging to the Estate of John Park Deceased And My Plantation utensils and I desire that the Money arising from the sale thereof may be applied towards Discharging all My Debts and the Residue Balance of the Money after paying my Debts to be equally Divided between My Son Robert Moseley and Thomas ~~Pearce~~ who married my Daughter Lettie, And I also desire that My Son Robert Moseley pay unto Mary ^{my} Willbourn ~~my~~ daughter who was married to the said
