at the discretion of my Executors Item I give and  
bequeath unto my Son Tho<sup>s</sup> Hoogen <sup>the remainder of the tract of</sup> the land whereon  
he now lives to him and his Heirs if he has none  
it is to be equally divided among the surviving Heirs  
of their heirs Item I give and bequeath unto my  
Son William the plantation whereon I now live to him  
and his heirs and if he has, it to be equally divided  
among the surviving heirs, or their heirs Item I

Among the Surviving heirs, or their heirs I  
give & bequeath unto my Grand Son Tho: Hogan the  
Son of John Hogan forty pounds current money to be  
left in the hands of his uncle Thomas Hogan until he  
is of age and if he should die before he is of age to be  
Equally Divided among the Surviving heirs or their heirs  
I give and bequeath unto my Son Daniel  
Hogan five Shillings Sterling being his part of all my  
Estate. I give and bequeath unto my  
Daughter Mary Hogan five Shillings Sterling being  
her part of all my estate. I desire that ~~the~~ my  
Moveable Estate shall be Equally divided and all my  
Slaves: Among my Children that is to say Tho:
