 a Christian like and Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors
 Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive
 the same again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such
 worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God To bless me in this Last
 I Give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form
 Inprimis I Give and bequath unto Margaret my deary
 bloud Wife three Cattle a Horse and a Mear and a bed and a post
 and one Dish and three plates I Give to my well beloved Son -

one pan one Dyph and three pleats and himself to be free at Eghen

Constat my whol and Sol Executor of this my last Will and
Testment I like ways Will and allow that if it would ples
God to call William Debel from hence without haer that all her
Affairs shall to his Mother fall. I do hereby utterly do away revoke
and disanoble all and every other former Testment Wills and
bequaths and Executors by me in any ways before this time
Mamed Willed and bequeashed Ratified and Confirmed this and no
other to be my last Will and Testment I witness here unto I have
knownts set my hand and Seal the day and year above written
