any manner shall think proper and when she shall please
after the time of my Decease

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth one bible & to my
Daughter Mary one bible & to my Son William one bible

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth the bible & no more
I give to my Daughter Sarah the bible & no more

I do also nominate constitute and appoint my Dear wife
Sarah & none other the sole executrix of this my last will &

Testament. In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this twenty fourth day of July 1779 years.
