Godby & Co. do make and publish and deliver this my last
will and testament in manner and to the following
that is to say:

Desiring to make provision for the support of all
my property, real and personal of which I am posses-
ed, I hereby give and bequeath, first, all my former
expenses shall have been paid together with my just
debt, (any) to my son Reason & Godby, all of my
property, both real and personal, with the accretions
and request that my beloved wife, Rhoda, should
during her natural life, hold and enjoy on her
of all my property bequeathed above, and at her
death to become the property of my son Reason & Godby.

The object of the testator in making this bequest to my
said son Reason & Godby, is in consideration of the
great trouble and expense already incurred in the
maintenance of the testator and his beloved wife
Rhoda, and to forever release my son Reason & Godby
from the payment of any sum, or sums of money
that may hereafter be claimed by any of my child-
ren as due and coming to them by any former
bequest of mine.

The foregoing figures is subject to the
right of my beloved wife, Rhoda, as already mention-
ed, and by will and desire is that my executor
shall assign her dower in my land, including the
dwelling house.
