I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Ann Farmer, the following described tract or parcel of land, to wit: Beginning at the East Corner of a tract of Eighty two Acres purchased by me from William Miller, Senior, and running north with the same to where it joins my Pine Swamp at a corner where there is some Oaks, thence with a line of the Pine Swamp to a double white Oak at the end of a line, thence to a double white Oak by John's fence, thence to a line of Oaks, a corner of the Pine Swamp, on a ridge near a line line, and thence a straight line to the beginning. All the land contained within the above boundaries. I give and bequeath to the said Elizabeth Ann Farmer, to her and her heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath to Jennima Farmer the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars, to be paid to her one of my estate in four equal Annual payments of Two Hundred Dollars each; the first payment to be made at the end of the second year immediately following my death.
