

I have given a fair share of my estate in the way of this creation.
I have then, I want to give the lower part of my plantation, containing the dwelling house and Guest Smith, bounded as follows. Beginning at the top of the lane in the west end of my lane, and running east with the lane, so as to crop the brick and run up to William Martin's line, dividing equally the large garden lot in front of the mill.
I have then

To my son John River I give the remainder or upper part of my plantation, also my Shetland Library left in my house by my son Thomas David, except Henry's Commentary and Davis's sermons, which I have given to Sarah Edith.

I have fourth. To my daughter Sarah Edith I give her two furnished beds, and her room. She is to have one room which is to be the choice of Miss Colli. She is to have her Bureau and dressing table and wash bottle and Bessy. She is also to have twenty pounds of silver annually to be taken out before my wife gets her third. But if the whole class of silver should fall short of one hundred pounds, then she is to have one fifth part. But in case she should leave this her present home, then she is to have one fourth of the stock, but not to exceed twenty sheep. She is to have privilege, so long as she may remain at the Old Farmstead of using and occupying two rooms, the east room up stairs and the little north side room downstairs. She is also to use and occupy her little garden and trees at the north corner of the house, and one sixth part of the large garden or lot in front of the mill. Also James Baymond is to pay her in view of the value of her land, five hundred dollars. (The hundred annually for four years) and John River the hundred, and then to be supported as one of the family.

I have fifth. To my two sons John River and James River I give all the remainder of my personal property, which I derive away and be sold as my indebtedness is so much reduced as not to make it necessary.

I have sixth. To my wife I give her lifetime interest or legal dower, to be used or occupied by her just as she may desire, and no conveyance made on this will is to be so used as to injure in any way, the present Mill estate.

And now I declare this division of my estate to be my last will and testament and I authorize and appoint my son John River to act and serve as my executor. Witness my hand and seal this thirtieth day of July. EIGHTH MONTH and thirty Five

To the Worshipful Court of Orleans County

The foregoing statement presents a Settlement of the account of William Hume as Administrator of Joseph Clark deceased, and shows a balance in the hands of the Administrator of Fifteen Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty four Dollars and Seventy Cents.

It is proper to state that the bond on A. Owens for \$3000, and that on Ruffe for \$3500, are subjects of litigation, and though charged to the Administrator in part of the report, such charge ought to affect him only to the extent of his recovery upon them. I have not estimated a interest upon these bonds, not doubting that the account now presented will have to be remodelled to adapt it to the standing of the Administrator in relation to the estate as developed upon the termination of the suits pending in relation to these, and other matters connected with the estate. It is proper further to state that all the debts charged to the Administrator are suspended by the stay law, but none of them having been returned by him, they are all debited to him as a matter of course. It will become the duty of the Commissioner, in making future settlements, to go into an investigation the more of the debts actually secured, and to have a statement upon the result of that investigation, instead of following the usual course of adopting the balance reported in this statement as the proper one with which to charge the Administrator. I have not allowed Commissions on the account of the debt to Owens and Ruffe & others, when the amount to be realized from these debts shall be ascertained. Commissions should then be allowed. Interest is charged to the term of the qualification of the Administrator, but kept separate from the principal to the close of the statement, with a view to facilitate future calculations. As one of the bonds on which was suspended during the war by the interest, I am informed, this was the case with the bond on Alexander and perhaps others. I am Credited the Administrator with the interest debited to
